9:00 – 9:15 Introduction

How does a world café work?

Some rules

- A mix of cos19 and cos20 students in a breakout room
- Groups of about 7 people
- One person is the host
- There are 2 questions to discuss.
- Students can speak and add ideas to the Miroboard. The question is posted at the Miro Board.
- After the first question the host remains in the breakout room, the students change to another room.

In a World Café, each table has a “host” who remains at their table through the entire exercise. The host’s role is to welcome participants to the table, provide an overview of the discussion and summarize key ideas shared by previous guests at the table.

9:15 – 9:40 Discussion of the first question

Question 1: What are you learning in COS / your work / your life at the moment?

9:40 – 9:45 Students change room and the host gives them a warm welcome

9:45 – 10:10 Discussion of the second question

Question 2: How does the pedagogical concept work for you?

The pedagogical concept behind COS is based upon:

- self- directed and self-responsible learning
- collaboration in the online group (Gilly Salmon concept, Online-Socialisation)
- connectivistic processes: aggregate, remix, repurpose, feed forward (Siemens, Downes) – share with others what you have learned
- learning in a community of practice (Wenger) – get connected with the content strategy community
- reflection in/on action (Schön) – task in the third semester



Everybody comes back, the breakout sessions end

10:10-10:30 Harvesting

The hosts tell about the key discussion topics, students can add their comments, everybody can visit the Miroboards.

The moderator will create a documentation of the world café.

Technical stuff

Breakout rooms

The moderator will send students automatically to the breakout rooms and she hopes that there's a mixture of cos19 and cos20 in every room. If there is a room with students only from one cohort 3 students should come back. The moderator will send them to new rooms, and in their new rooms every student should convince one other student to change to their previous room.

Suggestion about changing to another room after the discussion of the first question:

Students in room 1 choose numbers from 2-7, and then after the first session they change to the room of their number.
